





Woodworking Projectof the Year

The 2017 winner was Morland, based in Powys, Wales, who were recognised for design, innovation and technical excellence in their ABS Edge Banded Melamine Faced FD30 Fire Doors. The fire doors were praised by judges for combining high-end quality with mass market budgets.

The Group's Tricoat protected range of Multipoint Door Locks, Window Espagnolette Bolts and Tilt & Turn system has been shortlisted. This range has been designed to overcome the problems of fitting hardware into acidic timber such as Oak and Accoya®.

Process Efficiency

Implementing lean processes maximises value for money, quality and speed of delivery. This award recognises exceptional projects of this kind that have improved business performance. In 2017, AJB Group was given the award for their clear thinking and commitment to finding a solution to help drive its business performance and outputs forward. The company had invested heavily in its infrastructure over the previous two years – over £2 million had gone into new plant machinery, a new factory and various processes, to ensure the business kept ahead in the marketplace.

Their 'Health and Safety to Efficiency' initiative focuses upon the adequate capture of fine dust at source. This initiative has created a cleaner, safer working environment and the spray room has seen a significant reduction in fine dust contamination.





PDS Doorsets

Their factory and supply chain review has led to significant investment in technology and revision of their factory footprint. The review has resulted in efficiencies in productivity, building management and health and safety.

This award acknowledges individual or collective effort which has made a notable difference to the health and safety practices and business culture. The 2017 winner, Kevin Claughton of Cotswold Manufacturing Ltd in Stockton-on-Tees, was recognised for his focus and commitment. By reviewing the COSHH arrangements and changes to the way hazardous waste was contained and stored at the business, Kevin was able to make a cost saving of £18k per year. Kevin was instrumental in Cotswold Manufacturing's move to a new 89,000 sq ft factory, and has now trained 96 colleagues on health and safety matters - including the company directors. The award is in memory of Michael Lee, former Membership Director at the BWF who passed away in 2016.

Their design and installation of a high velocity vacuum system utilises their existing traditional LEV extraction system. The system provides overhead retractable on-tool extraction and bench cleanup. This removes the need for additional equipment creating a mess-free work area with improved air quality.



Oliver's work on a bespoke window sample for a property in Mayfair led to an order for windows and doors totalling over six figures.
